July 6-8 – Secret Storage Boxes- Slab and extruded boxes with cut away lids. For students of all levels, learn texturing, add decorative reliefs and glaze application.

July 13-15 – Wheel Throwing for Beginners- Students learn basic of throwing including wedging, centering, shaping and pulling handles for mugs. Limit 5

July 20-22 – Animal Bowls-Create pinch; slab and coil bowls then add details of your favorite animals. Great for cereal and ice cream!

August 10-12 – Bird houses or Bird Feeders- Create hanging bird houses from slab; decorate with your own personal style. Separating the interior chamber we can create a place to hold seed to feed our flying friends.
